The Northern Climate Change Network (NCCN) is a group of municipalities across northern Ontario working to assess and manage the risks and impacts of climate change.

With support from the **Climate Risk Institute** (CRI), member municipalities will initiate or advance climate change risk assessment and adaptation activities within their municipality. Communities will have opportunities to participate in learning forums, share experiences with peers, and build knowledge of adaptation solutions.
