


Climate change assessments inform decisions, raise awareness and build capacity



The Assessment Process

ENGAGE

Ongoing and broad outreach through surveys, workshops and conferences.

PLAN

Based on advice and views provided, outlines of the assessment products are developed.

ASSESS

Author teams hold workshops, gather, analyze and assess existing information and data, and draft the products.

FINALIZE

Content is finalized by the author teams to ensure scientific excellence, balance, clarity and accuracy.

LAUNCH

Assessment users and subject-matter experts meet to discuss the draft scope and goals of the assessment.

2023/2024

BUILD AUTHOR TEAMS

Subject-matter experts are invited to lead author teams representing a range of expertise and regions across Canada.

ADVISE

REVIEW

Expert reviewers critique the accuracy and completeness of the drafts.

2026/2027

RELEASE

Assessment products are translated, designed and made widely available.

2027/2028

An Advisory Committee, composed of assessment users and subject-matter experts, provides ongoing advice and input.
